

'Rez Goes Green' for second

The FSU Reservation (known as "the Rez") and FSU's Sustainable Campus and Community Committee will come together to hold Rez Goes Green II.

The event will focus on cleaning up the Lake Bradford Chain of Lakes on Saturday, March 1, from noon until 6 p.m.,

"The event started last year, when, in an effort to be good stewards of the FSU Reservation, we decided to do a clean-up of our 'backyard;' the beautiful Lake Bradford," said Lee Murphy, the director of the FSU Reservation and outdoor pursuits.

Due to the turnout and effects of last year's event, it was brought back again this year, said Murphy.

"Last year was so successful that we decided to make it a yearly event, hence, 'Rez goes Green II,'"said Murphy.

"Last year, the clean-up was on St. Patrick's Day so the event name had a clever twist. This year, we're hoping it still works."

There is another change to the event, Murphy continued.

"New this year, the 'Rez Goes Green' event is being held in cooperation with 'Keep Tallahassee-Leon County Beautiful' Super Clean Sweep event sponsored by Super Lube," said Murphy.

According to Murphy, the goal of the event is an environmental clean-up of Lake Bradford, Lake Hiawatha, Lake Minnehah, Cascade Lake and the surrounding forest area.

With all the lakes and forest to clean up, according to Murphy, they're looking for as many volunteers as they can find.

"Anyone is wanted and welcome to attend," said Murphy. "FSU students are especially encouraged."
